We are the only adult school located in the city of Alameda, CA. We are located near the Webster Tunnel and the College of Alameda. The nearest adult schools are Oakland Adult and Career Education and San Leandro Adult School.

Programs offered:

English as a Second Language (ESL)

We offer 6 Levels of non-credit ESL classes that range from Beginning Literacy to Advanced, offered in the morning (9:00 am – 12:00 pm) and evening (6:00 pm – 9:00 pm), with waitlist classes available in the afternoon for beginning ESL students. An ESL intervention teacher is available on Monday and Tuesday mornings to assist with beginning level students who need additional instructional support.

Family Literacy at Ruby Bridges Elementary

We offer a Family Literacy class at Ruby Bridges Elementary School to Alameda residents with school-aged children. Class occurs in the mornings Tuesday through Thursday 8:45 AM – 11:45 AM. Childcare is provided

High School Diploma & High School Equivalency Test Prep (GED/HiSET/TASC)

We offer a high school diploma program that includes courses in English, Social Studies, Math, and Science classes. In addition we offer test prep classes for the high school equivalency tests: the GED, HiSET and the TASC. Classes are offered at 3:30-6:00 pm or 6:30-9:00 pm. Class days are Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday. An intervention teacher is available for students who may need additional instruction support.

High School Equivalency Test Administration- HiSET Testing

We offer HiSET testing on Saturday mornings 3 times a year. There is currently no GED testing offered on our site.

Career Technical Education and Transitions

Diplomas through this program are awarded by the Piedmont Unified School District.

Oakland Unified School District's (OUSD) Oakland Adult and Career Education (OACE) has been committed to providing Adult Basic Education (ABE) and Adult Secondary Education (ASE) for immigrants, dropouts and those most vulnerable in Oakland for 145 years. OACE is the second oldest adult school in California, founded in 1871. OACE is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), and all instructors are credentialed by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. OACE has a community-based service delivery model, in 20 locations throughout the city of Oakland.

OACE Vision: OACE strives to be the resource for positive and continuous growth, enabling adult students to become contributing workers, lifelong learners, global citizens and full participants in their diverse communities.

OACE Mission: OACE provides high-quality foundational, instructional skill programs to Oakland adults and their families in order for them to succeed in education, work and life.

Student Learning Outcomes: OACE students will achieve work, life and academic skills including foundational skills in English, math and technology:

- To become college and career ready,
- To support their family's academic progress,
- To become fully participating members of their community

GED Test Preparation

GED test preparation classes prepare students to not only pass the new 2014 GED examination, but also to apply those academic skills to be successful in their roles as consumers, workers, parents and community members. Instruction is provided as a whole class, small group and individualized. GED classes are offered at Dewey High School, Ruidsdale High School, McClymonds High School, Madison Park Academy, Esperanza/Korematsu Schools, Allen Temple, the Unity Council (Spanish) and Youth Uprising. We are also piloting an Online Distance Learning program.

The General Educational Development (GED) certification is a high school equivalency, an alternative to a traditional high school diploma. OACE is a certified GED test center.

Family Literacy

The Family Literacy program offers skill instruction to parents so that they can better support their children's academic progress. Through ESL instruction, parents learn English language skills to better communicate with school staff and to become more engaged in the school. Through computer skill instruction, parents learn to access the parent portal, communicate with school staff and to find resources to help their children. Family Literacy classes are offered in collaboration with the following OUSD schools: Allendale, Coliseum College Preparatory Academy, Esperanza/Korematsu, Fruitvale, Garfield, and Martin Luther King, Jr. Additional schools are served through the mobile classroom.

The Family Literacy program has adopted the national family literacy model and is recognized nationally.

Career Technical Education (Project SEARCH)

Project SEARCH is a program that serves adults with developmental disabilities through a partnership among East Bay Innovations, OACE, the County of Alameda Government Offices and the Children's Hospital of Oakland. Year-long internships offer a combination of classroom instruction, career exploration and on-the-job training. The goal is to expose interns to careers, to build resumes and to attain employment using skills they have acquired.

College and Career Readiness Pathways

In 2016, OACE launched the College & Career Readiness Pathway program to provide adults with contextualized Basic English, math, ESL and study skills to successfully transition to academic and career technical education studies in the community college, or to gainful employment. In partnership within the Northern Alameda Consortium for Adult Education, students receive guidance and support in transitioning to the community college. The College and Career Readiness Pathways program is offered on the Merritt College campus, Allen Temple and MetWest High School (evening).

OACE is also providing contextualized math and English skills instruction in a team-teaching IBEST model (Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training) with Merritt and Laney Colleges. With this IBEST model, students have a higher persistence and completion rate.
